For nearly 40 years, DSACO has built programs and services based on the needs we hear our families express. More recently, we have received interest from the broader developmental disability community to expand our reach. While all DSACO money raised stays with our 1,200+ families, it is important to know that we are exploring ways to creatively fund these new programs and spread the love of learning to all those with a need. Ultimately, we build our learning programs for you--because of you. Our top priority is to ensure we can sustain these valuable programs for our families year after year.

3 Learning Aid Ohio started with an idea in the summer of 2020, with a commitment to invest \$125,000 of DSACO's reserve funds for free tutoring to what we expected would be 50-60 families. Through support from the Governor's Children's Initiative, the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, and the Ohio Department of Education, we have now been afforded the opportunity to serve hundreds of students with Down syndrome, as well as thousands of children with developmental disabilities in need of critical supplemental learning resources.

2 Adult Literacy Ohio was born out of our vision and belief that we should be advocating for access and resources than can support someone with Down syndrome in living up to their fullest potential. Last year, DSACO invested over \$100,000 in a pilot program to evaluate literacy outcomes through our model. Although we have over \$50,000 set aside for adults with Down syndrome for 2023, we're equally excited that the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities has awarded us funds to expand this work to not only adults with Down syndrome, but those with other developmental disabilities as well.

The IEP Kit Program is our latest endeavor in which DSACO has invested over \$30,000 to date. We have been thrilled with our survey feedback from this new offering and are actively exploring ways to underwrite this valuable resource that's already been provided to hundreds of DSACO families.



We are humbled to be in a position to make these investments to explore and innovate—all thanks to you, your friends, and our community donors who trust us to do the work. We look forward to dreaming up, building out, and implementing new programs and services in the future thanks to all the ways you so generously support us!





A STABLE account is a specialized investment and savings account administered by the Ohio Treasurer's Office, designed to benefit eligible individuals with disabilities. By utilizing STABLE accounts, individuals can save and invest funds for qualified disability-related expenses, such as education, housing, and transportation. Importantly, STABLE accounts allow individuals to maintain eligibility for federally funded benefits like Medicaid and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) while saving money.

- The process of eligibility, enrollment, and fund management within a STABLE account
- Real-life experiences shared by STABLE account owners
- Strategies to effectively manage multiple STABLE accounts



Celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month

Starting on September 15, we celebrate the culture and contributions of Americans with roots in Spain, Mexico, Central America, South America, and the Spanish-speaking countries of the Caribbean.

In 1968, Congress authorized President Lyndon B. Johnson to proclaim National Hispanic Heritage Week, which fell on the week of September 15.

Twenty years later, on August 17, 1988, President Ronald Reagan reiterated a broader recognition of Hispanic Americans. For this purpose, Congress passed a law that extends the celebration for a period of 31 days – from September 15 to October 15. National Hispanic Heritage Month now includes significant dates marking the anniversary of the independence of some Latin American countries such as Costa Rica, El Salvador, Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua.



Medically Speaking

Do you see what I see?

Many parents are surprised to learn that young children do not need to read letters on an eye chart for a pediatric eye doctor to assess their eye health, visual acuity, and the potential need for glasses.

Eye and vision issues are quite common (60-80%) in children and adults with Down syndrome. Variations in eye formation (such as cataracts and blocked tear ducts), focusing abilities (requiring glasses), eye coordination (misalignment and lazy eye), and visual processing by the brain can all be observed. Early detection of these concerns through pediatric screenings and regular comprehensive eye exams can significantly improve visual outcomes for individuals with Down syndrome.

InfantSEE is a national program where participating optometrists provide a comprehensive eye examination to infants from 6-12 months of age at no cost to the family. All children should receive an infant eye examination, not only children with Down syndrome or when parents see problems. **DID YOU KNOW?** 80% of individuals with Down syndrome need glasses.

When may my child need glasses?

All children have a refractive error, which refers to the need for a prescription in their vision. Infants typically have slight farsightedness (hyperopia) and mild astigmatism within the normal range. Glasses are prescribed when a child falls outside the normal range for their age. As children grow, so does the size of their eyes, which affects their prescription. Consequently, a child may have good vision one year but require glasses the next due to the elongation of the eye, leading to nearsightedness (myopia) and blurry distance vision.

Certain forms of blurry vision can be identified in infancy, while others may require glasses during preschool years. Children with Down syndrome tend to show less reduction in prescription with growth compared to their typical peers. Additionally, some elementary-age children with Down syndrome may benefit from bifocal lenses. These students may have a reduced "autofocus" ability, leading to difficulties with clear near vision. Research has demonstrated that children aged 8-18 with Down syndrome experienced improved literacy skills after wearing bifocal lenses.

Why may my child need glasses?

Glasses may be prescribed to enhance clarity of vision (nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism), correct eye alignment (strabismus), or facilitate binocular vision (amblyopia). Higher prescriptions and imbalances in prescription (greater in one eye) are also common. Failure to address these high and/or unequal prescriptions through glasses can impede visual development.

Amblyopia refers to poor vision, often in one eye, caused by misaligned eyes (strabismus) or unequal prescriptions. Although vision can be improved at any age, early treatment typically yields better results. Research over the past two decades has shown that part-time patching of the good eye (2 hours/day) or weekend use of dilating eye drops in the good eye (atropine 1%) can lead to improved vision.

All children should receive an eye examination by an optometrist or ophthalmologist during infancy, in Instead of penalizing one eye to strengthen the fellow, the future of amblyopia treatment is binocular.

The FDA recently approved the Luminopia One device for children 4-7 years of age with amblyopia. The child watches a modified TV show in a virtual reality (VR) headset for 1 hour each day. The picture in the good eye is blurred to encourage the brain to use the weaker eye.

the preschool years, and yearly when in school. These eye examinations are even more important for patients with Down syndrome, given the higher rates of eye conditions that reduce vision and quality of life for individuals in this population.

TIPS before EYE EXAMS

- Check to see if the eye doctor routinely examines patients with developmental disabilities.
- Ask if you can bring snacks, videos, or your child's favorite stuffed animal to the appointment.
- Watch a YouTube video about getting an eye examination Dr. Cara recommends Little Angel (Eye Doctor Checkup), Peppa Pig (episode 94), plus many others on YouTube.
