Exciting News: DSACO's Post-Secondary Scholarships Are Back!

We are thrilled to announce that DSACO's Post-Secondary Scholarships, made possible through the generous support of the GLOW Foundation, are making a return! This initiative aims to provide crucial financial assistance to siblings, parents, cousins, or other relatives of people with Down syndrome who plan to pursue careers that will make a positive impact on the lives of people with Down syndrome.

Who's Eligible?

Siblings, parents, cousins, or other relatives of individuals with Down syndrome are eligible to apply.

Current college students with Down syndrome are also strongly encouraged to apply.

To qualify for these scholarships, applicants must reside within one of the 23 counties in DSACO's service area.

Application Details:

All completed applications must reach us no later than Wednesday, January 31, 2024. Please ensure that your application is comprehensive, as incomplete submissions will not be considered for the scholarship.

Scholarship Awards:

Once applications have been received by DSACO, they are made anonymous and sent to a committee for scoring. This anonymization process is in place to ensure that all applications are evaluated without any potential bias. The Post-Secondary Scholarship Committee responsible for scoring these applications is composed of esteemed



individuals, including college professors, leaders within the disability community, and dedicated supporters from the GLOW Foundation. This diverse panel guarantees a fair and impartial assessment of each application, reflecting our commitment to providing equal opportunities for all applicants. The scholarship recipients will be selected and announced during the week of February 25th.


KATIE CUNDIFF



Understanding Prenatal Genetic Testing for Down Syndrome: Guidance and Options

The journey of pregnancy is marked by anticipation and questions, especially regarding the health of the unborn child. Down syndrome, a chromosomal condition, is one of the concerns for expectant parents. In the past, the choice of genetic tests was often determined by the pregnant person's age. However, in October 2020, the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Society of Maternal Fetal Medicine released updated guidelines advocating that genetic screening and diagnostic testing options be offered to all pregnant individuals, regardless of age or risk factors (ACOG Practice Bulletin No. 226. American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. Obstet Gynecol 2020;136:e48-69). With numerous tests available, seeking guidance from a prenatal genetic counselor can be invaluable in making informed decisions about prenatal genetic testing.

Who is a Prenatal Genetic Counselor?

Prenatal genetic counselors, sometimes known as reproductive genetic counselors, are specialized professionals who excel in obtaining information about a person's pregnancy, medical history, and family history. They provide insights into the likelihood of certain health conditions, including Down syndrome, in the pregnancy. Additionally, prenatal genetic counselors offer families the opportunity to explore whether it is beneficial to gain knowledge about potential health conditions before their baby's birth. The decision to undergo genetic testing varies from family to family, and prenatal genetic counselors respect these unique choices.

Types of Prenatal Testing:

There are two primary categories of prenatal testing:

Prenatal Screening Tests: These tests utilize a maternal blood sample and sometimes an ultrasound to provide information about the likelihood of a pregnancy having Down syndrome and other health conditions. They are non-invasive and pose no risk to the pregnancy. However, they cannot definitively confirm whether a pregnancy has Down syndrome. Each screening test has varying levels of accuracy for Down syndrome and other conditions. If a "positive" screening result is obtained, further tests are necessary to confirm the diagnosis. Examples of prenatal screening tests include:

- **cfDNA**: sometimes called Non-Invasive Prenatal Testing (NIPT) or Non-Invasive Prenatal Screening (NIPS)
 - » Only requires a blood sample
 - » Can be performed anytime after 9-10 weeks of the pregnancy

- First Trimester Screen
 - » Requires a blood draw and ultrasound
 - » Can only be performed in the first trimester of pregnancy
- Quad Screen
 - » Only requires a blood sample
 - » Can only be performed in the second trimester of pregnancy

Prenatal Diagnostic Tests: These tests involve procedures such as chorionic villus sampling (CVS) and amniocentesis. They can provide a conclusive answer about whether a pregnancy has Down syndrome or other health conditions. However, these procedures carry a risk of miscarriage or pregnancy complications. Prenatal diagnostic tests include:

- Chromosome analysis (karyotype analysis)
- Microarray analysis

Each prenatal test has its own set of benefits and limitations. Therefore, consulting with a prenatal genetic counselor or a qualified medical professional is crucial to making informed choices. Additionally, there is a screening test for Down syndrome available to individuals undergoing in vitro fertilization (IVF) called preimplantation genetic testing for aneuploidy (PGT-A).

Considerations for Family Members:

If a person is pregnant or planning a pregnancy and has a relative with Down syndrome, they may be offered a meeting with a prenatal genetic counselor. Although Down syndrome typically occurs by chance, in some cases, it is linked to an inherited translocation (a chromosome rearrangement). Families with an inherited translocation have a slightly higher risk of having pregnancies with Down syndrome or other health conditions. Therefore, individuals who are pregnant or planning a pregnancy may find it beneficial to determine whether their relative with Down syndrome has an inherited translocation. This information can guide discussions with a prenatal genetic counselor or doctor regarding the likelihood of their pregnancy having Down syndrome and the most suitable genetic testing



options, if desired.

For those interested in learning more about genetic testing for Down syndrome before or during pregnancy, a referral to a prenatal genetic counselor can be requested from an OBGYN, adult primary care provider, or genetics provider. Making informed decisions about genetic testing empowers individuals and families to navigate the journey of pregnancy with knowledge and confidence.
