# LIMITLESS LEARNING FOR PEOPLE WITH DOWN SYNDROME

DSACO empowers people with Down syndrome and other developmental disabilities to achieve their full potential at every stage of life. It was a banner year for launching key programs that drive this purpose forward including IEP kits and a highly successful Adult Literacy Pilot program.

# LIMITLESS OUTREACH TO FAMILIES AT ALL STAGES, IN ALL PLACES

Through outreach, we empower families to become advocates for their loved ones and to play an important part in ensuring a lifetime of opportunities. Our outreach efforts are intentionally concentrated on connecting new families, reaching diverse and geographically dispersed families, and engaging all members of the family. In 2022, DSACO earned the Nationwide Children's Hospital Community Partner Award in recognition of our outreach efforts.

# LIMITLESS INCLUSION FOR PEOPLE WITH DEVELOPMENT DISABILITIES IN OUR COMMUNITIES

When people and their families recognize their potential, the final piece of the limitless puzzle is helping broader communities see it, too. Through advocacy and awareness efforts, DSACO works at the local, state, and federal level to combat the challenges and limits our community faces daily. Creating a new division of services for the broader, statewide developmental disability community has been a major accomplishment for our team and critical to expanding our vision for limitless.

It all comes down to the value we deliver to the people we serve. The work that DSACO accomplished in 2022 and that we continue to do each day is removing limits. People with Down syndrome and development disabilities have more opportunities today than they did a year ago. But ultimately, the real measure of success lies in the hearts of the people we serve. Are they feeling limitless? Are their lives improved by the effort?

Resoundingly, yes! Our 2022 member survey results show that 92% of DSACO families feel more supported and connected because of participation with DSACO. And our Net Promoter Score of 83.2% illustrates world class levels of program participant satisfaction, loyalty, and enthusiasm.

# A Lifetime Without Limits Starts With The Right Expectations



When we found out we were expecting our second baby, my husband and I were so excited! We were told that we had a five percent chance of conceiving naturally, so to find out we were having a second child was nothing short of amazing. During a routine ultrasound, however, we were told that our baby possibly had Down syndrome. Hearing this was hard, and I felt saddened by this unexpected news.

At 39 weeks, our sweet Emilio was born. I remember going through a roller coaster of emotions during that first month with such feelings of sadness and worrying about the unknowns. My husband and close friends were so supportive during that time and soon my feelings of "why me" and "why us" turned into "why not us?"

Connecting to DSACO early on was such an important part of this journey. I've been able to connect with moms who are just like me, who felt feelings like I did, and I learned more about their stories as well. It has been so amazing to have a support system and other mom mentors who are walking a similar path.

Being a part of this amazing DSACO community has helped me to openly accept that our life with Emilio might look a little different, but now I can see a bright and thriving future for him and our family.

# Early Outreach Customized to Each Family's Needs

All families are unique in how they process a diagnosis. In 2022, we packaged our early outreach efforts in a variety of ways.

- Welcomed 50 new babies from 13 counties
- Matched 15 families with a First Connect Parent Mentor to help navigate the new journey
- Provided multiple hours of complimentary couples counseling from licensed professionals to help new parents work through the full range of early emotions
- Delivered 7 enhanced hospital care packages featuring a heart charm necklace to babies with Down syndrome undergoing open heart surgery

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# Taking the First Steps **Toward A Limitless Future**

Adjusting to and accepting a Down syndrome diagnosis is a major milestone that's often intensely personal for a family and its inner circle. As children grow and their circles widen, families need continuous support navigating the new territory.

DSACO is extremely intentional about outreach and advocacy during this phase. Our goal is to

ensure fair and equitable opportunities exist within our communities and service area for all young children with disabilities. We aim to provide the right level of support and encouragement so that families can confidently take advantage of these opportunities and enjoy positive experiences within the community.

# SCHOLARSHIP HIGHLIGHT

# The Ann Barbour Music & Performing Arts Scholarship

A lifelong music lover and educator, the arts were an integral part of Ann Barbour's life. Throughout her years, she participated in many musical productions and accompanied services at church as well as other special events. She also taught piano lessons and served as a choir music director.

When she passed away in 2015, her family created the Ann Barbour Scholarship program with memorial donations they received. The scholarship honors Ann's passion for music and her love for her grandson, Ben, who has Down syndrome. DSACO families can access the funding for community classes related to music and the performing arts.





When Johnnie was 16 months old, his parents, Chrissy and Matt, enrolled him in Music Matters classes, taking advantage of the Ann Barbour Music & Performing Arts Scholarship to cover the tuition. The experience was a tremendous success from both a developmental and social perspective.

We will continue to enroll Johnnie in the class twice a year because it has been so beneficial to his development-speech, physical, socialemotional, and musical. It's amazing to see him sing along and participate in and outside of class. It is also a wonderfully inclusive experience."

# Reconnecting **Families With** Their Broader Communities

In 2022, with communities still adjusting to the return to in-person experiences post-pandemic, DSACO doubled down on providing meaningful experiences and fostering connections to ensure children with Down syndrome were not overlooked.

- Relaunched in-person Little **Buddies Resource Group** meetings in May
- Hosted 4 Little Buddies Playgroup events including an indoor swim party, family yoga and story time in the park, a Little Buddies picnic, and a fall outing to Lynd Fruit Farm
- Offered Jump Start Swim **Clinics** in 3 Goldfish Swim School locations throughout **Central Ohio**
- Awarded \$17,000 in recreation, performing arts, and education scholarships to support participation in community camps and programs across our service area

# **Building the Foundation** for Limitless Learning

Heading off to the first day of kindergarten ignites a years-long chain reaction of important milestones and exciting learning and socialization opportunities for all children. While students with Down syndrome will face unique challenges all along the journey, they must be empowered to participate in and enjoy the full range of experiences during this critical stage of development, so they can achieve their individual potential right alongside their peers.

DSACO takes a proactive approach to getting ahead of any possible roadblocks to lifelong learning. We equip our families with the right resources and support at each step, so families and students can keep moving forward and successfully navigate the additional complexities that inevitably come with the school years.

# Learning Aid Ohio


Launched in 2020 in response to the challenges posed by the pandemic and distance learning, the innovative Learning Aid Ohio initiative rapidly gained traction and has evolved into one of DSACO's largest and most influential programs touching students in nearly every county in the state.

Learning Aid Ohio subsidizes the cost to hire tutors, aides, or in-home providers who can

provide one-to-one learning support for students with developmental disabilities on IEPs or Section 504 Plans. Born out of the need to help close the learning loss gap resulting from remote and hybrid schooling, the landmark program is helping students with developmental disabilities get the support they need to achieve their learning goals and unlock their full potential.

# SEPT 2020

**DSACO** launches its Supplemental Learning Initiative to help DSACO families navigate the challenges of distance learning

OCT 2020 The program attracts the attention of the Ohio Department of **Developmental Disabilities (DODD)** and Governor Mike DeWine

NOV 2021

**DSACO** partners with DODD and the Governor's Children's Initiative to rename the program Learning Aid Ohio and expand statewide, making subsidized tutoring available to any Ohio student with an IEP or 504 plan

MAY 2022

Grants made available to qualifying students (up to three \$1,500 grants per year)

AUG 2022

**Learning Aid Ohio reaches** more than 2,200 students across 74 Ohio counties

# Innovating **Programs for** Academic, Emotional, and Social Learning

DSACO aims to provide services that help school-age kids learn and develop in every way that matters. In 2022, we made major strides forward.

- Launched IEP Kits to help DSACO families prepare for often overwhelming IEP meetings
- Opened an additional Summer Learning Academy **classroom** for a total of 9 classrooms in 7 locations
- Delivered 130 Down Syndrome Awareness Book **Bundles** to schools
- Relaunched quarterly in-person School Aged **Social Group meetups**
- Supported 64 participants in learning important life skills during iCan Bike and iCan Swim camps





# **Removing The Limits to** Healthy Independence

When you're a teenager, testing the limits comes with the territory. But for teens with developmental disabilities, this rite of passage can be even more challenging than it is for most young people.

DSACO aims to give teenagers in our community the space and opportunities they need to safely build their own independence and confidence.

While teens and their families can and do continue to take advantage of many of the learning programs and resources DSACO offers to all school age children, including Learning Aid Ohio, IEP kits, and recreation and arts scholarships and camps, DSACO also focuses on providing healthy engagement and meaningful connections just for them.

# **GROUP HIGHLIGHT**

# High School Social Group

Isolation during the pandemic affected teens in unique ways, and DSACO helped make up for lost time by introducing the High School Social Group in 2022. The group offers regular exciting events that help teens connect or reconnect with their peers.

Yes, fun, games, and, of course, food, are a big part of DSACO's monthly High School Social Group meetups. But there's a lot more happening at these events behind the scenes.

The monthly outings are intentionally designed to give teens opportunities to build friendships and foster independence in a safe and supportive environment.

DSACO staff and volunteers host the events and families are encouraged to drop off and pick up or gather separately in their own space. The idea is for teens to get more comfortable with exploring and developing their own independence. And it's working beautifully!





Lucy is a DSACO teen who has embraced high school social group full on. According to her mom, Mandy, the High School Social Group has provided a safe and supportive environment for Lucy to practice and gain independent social skills.

"She's developed friendships that reach beyond the monthly meetings." Mandy says. "Without these monthly events, these connections and relationships wouldn't be possible. It's such an important part of growing up that she wasn't getting anywhere else."

# **Offering Programs** for Nurturing a Healthy Sense of Self

In 2022, DSACO offered teen programs specifically designed to encourage the social and emotional development that is so important during these years.

- Offered the First Tee® Golf Academy Program for youth 12 and older of all skills levels
- Hosted 4 Quarterly Outreach Group events for teens with Down syndrome and their siblings including an indoor and outdoor pool party and the popular pumpkin patch event
- Presented a 3-part comprehensive Safety Series covering online safety, community safety, and interpersonal safety
- Hosted a puberty webinar to address the most frequently identified issues and concerns of parents of tweens with intellectual disabilities

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# Living Life Without Limits

DSACO is committed to building lifelong connections with the people and families we serve and to offering resources, support, and relevant programming through every stage of life. When a person with Down syndrome becomes an adult, our partnership often becomes more critical as other resources and opportunities that young people have during the school years become less accessible. DSACO aims to help adults continue to be limitless by providing ongoing learning and education opportunities, life skills development programs, and social activities, so adults with Down syndrome can live their lives to the fullest.

# INNOVATION HIGHLIGHT

# Adult Literacy Pilot Program

The ability to read is fundamental to living an independent and fulfilled life. It is tied to health outcomes, housing access, workforce advancement, and everyday activities including navigating a grocery store or simply getting lost in the magic of a good book.

But it's a skill that many adults with Down syndrome struggle to master. To address the challenges head on, DSACO took a page out of our widely successful Learning Aid Ohio initiative and modeled a new Adult Literacy Pilot program in 2022.

Justice really enjoyed school. He was heavily involved in band, choir, and theater. His high school career included involvement in two theater productions and the title of Prom King. Months, and then years, flipped by on the calendar, Justice's siblings went off to pursue higher education, and eventually it was Justice's turn to proudly don a cap and gown and celebrate his high school graduation. He climbed the mountain that was the K-12 education system, with a loving and supportive family beside him every step of the way. Now what?

"Now What?" is something we hear from so many families. The transition from a school environment into adulthood is a big deal for everyone. No matter what level of support is in place through the local county board, post-secondary settings, or employment-based initiatives – it's a huge transition.

Stories like Justice's sparked DSACO's Adult Literacy Pilot program. Justice Wollenburg was part of the seventeen original pilot participants in 2022.

Michelle, Justice's Mom, said she is hopeful about the future of the program and what it means for Justice and other adults like him. During the pilot, she noticed positive changes in Justice. "He is already feeling so excited, fulfilled, and proud." said Michelle. "We live in a more rural area where resources are harder to find. Being able to drive a few minutes to meet with a highly qualified reading professional makes this accessible and sets us up for success."



# Building Skills for a Lifetime of Opportunities

In 2022, our adult programming featured a mix of in-person and online opportunities to engage as many adults in our community as possible.

- Promoted independence by hosting 24 virtual cooking classes, facilitated by guest chefs, where participants learned to safely prepare meals on their own
- Hosted 12 monthly Stamping Club meetups to promote creativity and socialization
- Offered 2, 10-week sessions of Improv Classes to improve confidence, engagement, creativity, and problem-solving skills
- Hosted 117 conference goers at the action-packed 2022 adult conference covering topics including supported decision making, planning for the future, and assistive technology

# **Taking Thousands Of Steps** In The Right Direction

On October 2, 2022, more than 10,000 supporters from our community and all across the country joined DSACO at Fortress Obetz for the 2022 Columbus Buddy Walk. The DSACO community rallied to form 269 teams that collectively raised \$548,529 to help fund DSACO's critical work. Team members traveled from 28 different states to be part of this important celebration, and donations came from every state in the country and abroad.

The 2022 Buddy Walk teams honored and celebrated individuals with Down syndrome of all ages and included family members, friends, educators, intervention specialists, therapists,

medical professionals, employers, coworkers, and community members, all of whom play an important role in removing limits and ensuring a lifetime of opportunity for people with Down syndrome.

Our thanks go out to the 2022 Buddy Walk teams, many of whom have walked, advocated, and donated year after year. We are limitless in what we can achieve together!



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# **Financial Health**

DSACO's budgeted revenue target was \$4,683,100 in 2022. We outperformed, exceeding our "exceeds+" target of \$5M, ending the year with \$5,053,352. We outperformed in two of three fundraising events, donations, program sponsorships, while also obtaining a \$182,888 Employee Retention Tax Credit. Additionally, DSACO secured funding for two new business lines, IEP Kits and Adult Literacy, both of which were developed and launched in 2022.
